



MASTER OF ACCOUNTANCY DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

for Juris Doctor/Master of Accountancy Students

Through our partnership with the School of Law, we offer the concurrent Juris Doctor/Master of Accountancy program, which allows students to take courses that provide credit for both degrees. By pursuing the degrees concurrently, students complete the 30-hour Master of Accountancy (MACCY) and the 90-hour Juris Doctor (JD) with 108 hours of coursework. Six hours of the MACCY degree are counted toward the JD degree, and six hours of the JD degree are used to complete the MACCY degree. Students participating in the concurrent degree program must be admitted by both the School of Law and the Graduate School/Patterson School of Accountancy.

The Master of Accountancy program requires 10 three-hour courses, including four required accountancy and taxation courses, four accountancy electives, and two non-accountancy electives. Students will choose two cross-listed law courses as accountancy electives; those courses will also be counted toward the law degree. Students will choose two three-hour law courses to be counted as non-accountancy electives. Students must enroll in all 31 hours of required first-year law courses in one academic year.
